Redevelopment of Colva under Swadesh Darshan 2.0

Tourism Minister Shri Rohan A. Khaunte met shop owners at Colva to discuss the first phase of redevelopment under Swadesh Darshan 2.0, aimed at upgrading infrastructure, amenities, and visitor experience while ensuring local interests are protected. With existing structures in poor condition, a masterplan has been prepared that includes improved facilities, an Arrival Avenue, a pedestrian bridge, enhanced security, and upgraded public spaces. Shopkeepers will be temporarily shifted to designated containers during construction, with the government assuring a smooth transition and restored amenities once redevelopment is complete.

TM holds meeting with Shack Owners

Tourism Minister Shri Rohan A. Khaunte held a meeting with shack owners and associations to address issues related to the shack policy and reported subletting cases. After reviewing complaints, 23 shacks were found to be sublet and initially marked for cancellation. Following representations from stakeholders and consultations with the Chief Minister, the Government has decided to reconsider these cases, allowing licence renewal once issues are resolved and dues are cleared, with strict compliance required on the non-subletting clause.



Oman Delegation Visits Goa

A distinguished delegation from Oman visited Goa on a three-day familiarisation tour that showcased the state's culture, heritage, gastronomy, and immersive local experiences. The group explored historic landmarks such as the Aguad Port and Jail Complex, Old Goa's churches, and the Figueiredo House, while also experiencing Goan hospitality through curated village experiences, backwater boat rides, traditional dining, and interactions hosted by the Hon'ble Tourism Minister Shri Rohan A. Khaunte and Director of Tourism Shri Kedar Naik. The visit strengthened cultural ties and opened new avenues for future collaborations between Goa and Oman.

World Tourism Day Meet

Goa Tourism, along with TTAG and SKAL International Goa, marked World Tourism Day 2025 with its largest-ever Stakeholders' Meet at Grand Hyatt Goa, bringing together industry leaders, government officials, hoteliers, tour operators, students, and community representatives. 
20 Refurbished Toilets Handed Over to Sulabh International

The Department of Tourism, Government of Goa, has handed over the operation and maintenance of 20 refurbished public toilet facilities at key tourist locations to Sulabh International, strengthening sanitation services under the Swachh Bharat vision. After terminating the previous operator due to noncompliance, GTDC regained possession of the blocks and refurbished them, ensuring they remain functional for visitors. The facilities located across major sites including Baga, Colva, Morjim, Varca, Cavelossim, Mobor, Siridao, Sernabatim and Fatorda will now be managed on a pay-and-use basis, while one block has been given to the Candolim panchayat for refurbishment and operation.



Inclusive Mandovi Boat Cruise

As part of World Tourism Day 2025, Goa Tourism, in collaboration with Rotary Club of Panaji, Paradise Cruises, TTAG, and SKAL International Goa, hosted an inclusive River Mandovi boat cruise for senior citizens, persons with disabilities, and children from orphanages.
