Dept of Tourism Tightens Tourism Law

The Government of Goa has strengthened its tourism legislation by passing the Goa Tourist Places (Protection and Maintenance) (Amendment) Act, 2025, aimed at ensuring cleaner, safer, and more responsible tourist destinations. The amendment expands the definition of public nuisance to include activities such as unauthorised hawking, littering, ticket touting, and illegal water sports operations, while increasing penalties for violations. It also empowers the Tourism Department to periodically revise fines, reinforcing the state's commitment to sustainable and regenerative tourism practices.

TM Khaunte Reviews Kharewada Restoration

Tourism Minister Shri Rohan A. Khaunte, fulfilling an Assembly assurance, reviewed the restoration of Kharewada Beach along with local MLA Shri Krishna Daji Salkar, Director of Tourism Shri Kedar Naik, and officials.
